Early detection of colorectal cancer leads to better patient care and improved survival rates, as well as less invasive, less expensive treatments. The Fecal Immunochemical Test (FIT), also known as the "ICT test", is the recommended screening method for colorectal cancer by the Center for Disease Control (CDC). The non-invasive FIT test is clean and simple to use, has no dietary or medicinal restrictions, and has 98% sensitivity and specificity.

Recent analysis shows only 15% of FIT tests distributed to patients of RML clients actually return to the laboratory for testing. RML is committed to increasing patient compliance with FIT testing through improved patient tracking, education and awareness measures. In order to truly make an impact, RML requests your assistance with the following items:

1. In order to accurately track test kits provided to patients and send them kind reminders to return the kit in a timely manner, please place the following pending order when handing out a test kit. This test is available for electronic ordering and may also be indicated on the RML manual requisition.
