- 1. Make a Transition Plan
 - a. Identify which staff members will help implement ICD-10
 - b. Obtain access to ICD-10 Codes
- 2. Train Your Staff

ICD-10

- a. Get up to speed
 - b. Identify top codes and code current cases in ICD-10
- 3. Update Your Processes
 - a. Get your forms ready
 - Resolve any documentation gaps identified while coding top diagnoses in ICD-10

- 4. Talk to Your Vendors and Payers
 - a. Call your vendors to confirm the ICD-10 readiness of your practice's systems.
 - b. Confirm that the health plans, clearinghouses, and third-party billing services you work with are ICD-10 ready
- 5. Test Your Systems and Processes
 - a. Verify that you can use your ICD-10ready systems to generate a claim
 - Explore alternate ways to submit claims to health plans if you think your systems might not be ready for ICD-10 by Oct 1

It is important to understand the major improvements and changes between ICD-9 and ICD-10 diagnosis codes.
